

NBC4/Marist Poll Maryland Likely Democratic Primary Voters

April 2016

How the Survey was Conducted

Nature of the Sample: NBC4/Marist Maryland Poll of 2,913 Adults

This survey of 2,913 adults was conducted April 5th through April 9th, 2016 by The Marist Poll sponsored and funded in partnership with NBC4. Adults 18 years of age and older residing in the state of Maryland were contacted on landline or mobile numbers and interviewed in English by telephone using live interviewers. Landline telephone numbers were randomly selected based upon a list of telephone exchanges from throughout the state of Maryland from ASDE Survey Sampler, Inc. The exchanges were selected to ensure that each region was represented in proportion to its population. Respondents in the household were randomly selected by first asking for the youngest male. This landline sample was combined with respondents reached through random dialing of cell phone numbers from Survey Sampling International. Both samples were matched by telephone number to a voter registration list for the state. Voter information was appended to each matched case. Assistance was provided by Luce Research for data collection and L2 for voter registration information. After the interviews were completed, the two samples were combined and balanced to reflect the 2013 American Community Survey 5-year estimates for age, gender, income, race, and region. Results are statistically significant within ± 1.8 percentage points. There are 2,563 registered voters. The results for this subset are statistically significant within ± 1.9 percentage points. Among registered voters, 1,151 had a phone match in the voter file and 1,412 did not. The results for these subsets are statistically significant within ± 2.9 percentage points and ± 2.6 percentage points, respectively. There are 653 voters in the potential Republican primary electorate. The potential Republican primary electorate in Maryland includes all registered Republicans. There are 1,357 voters in the potential Democratic primary electorate. The potential Democratic primary electorate in Maryland includes all registered Democrats. The results for these subsets are statistically significant within ± 3.8 percentage points and ± 2.7 percentage points, respectively. There are 368 likely Republican primary voters and 775 likely Democratic primary voters defined by a probability turnout model which determines the likelihood respondents will participate in the 2016 Maryland Republican/Democratic Presidential Primary based upon their chance of vote, interest in the election, and past election participation. The results for these subsets are statistically significant within ± 5.1 percentage points and ± 3.5 percentage points, respectively. The error margin was not adjusted for sample weights and increases for cross-tabulations.
