How the Survey was Conducted

Nature of the Sample: Marist Poll of 577 Westchester County Adults

This survey of 577 Westchester County adults was conducted by the Marist Poll in partnership with the Business Council of Westchester County on September 23rd and September 24th, 2013. Adults 18 years of age and older residing in Westchester County were interviewed by telephone. Telephone numbers were selected based upon a list of telephone exchanges from throughout the county. To increase coverage, this landline sample was supplemented by respondents reached through random dialing of cell phone numbers. The samples were then combined and balanced to reflect the 2010 Census results for age, gender, income, and race. Results for adults are statistically significant within ±4.1 percentage points. There are 481 registered voters. Results for this subset are statistically significant within ±4.5 percentage points. There are 375 homeowners. The results for this subset are statistically significant within ±5.1 percentage points. The error margin increases for cross-tabulations.
