How the Survey was Conducted

Nature of the Sample: WNBC/Telemundo 47/POLITICO/Marist Poll of 876 New York City Likely Democratic Primary Voters

This survey of 876 likely Democratic primary voters was conducted June 3rd through June 9th, 2021 by The Marist Poll sponsored in partnership with WNBC, Telemundo 47, and POLITICO. Likely Democratic primary voters were contacted on landline or mobile numbers and interviewed by telephone using live interviewers. Survey questions were available in English or Spanish. Using the L2 voter file of New York City registered Democrats, mobile and landline telephone numbers were randomly selected based on voters' likelihood of participating in the Democratic primary for mayor. The full sample is balanced to age, gender, race, and borough based on the voter registration list information and adjusted for turnout in similar elections. Assistance was provided by Luce Research for data collection. Results for the entire sample of likely Democratic primary voters are statistically significant within ±3.8 percentage points. Tables include results for subgroups to only display crosstabs with an acceptable sampling error. It should be noted that although you may not see results listed for a certain group, it does not mean interviews were not completed with those individuals. It simply means the sample size is too small to report. The error margin was adjusted for sample weights and increases for cross-tabulations.
