This Marist Poll reports:

• It's a Wonderful Life Reigns Supreme: There's a reason Frank Capra's 1946 Christmas classic, It's a Wonderful Life, shows up around this time every year. It's the favorite holiday movie of 19% of Americans. Little Ralphie and his Red Ryder BB rifle aren't far behind! A Christmas Story tops the list for 17% of U.S. residents. 9% of Americans prefer Miracle on 34th Street, and 7% enjoy watching Bing Crosby croon in White Christmas. A Christmas Carol and Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer each receive 6%.

• Leading the Way...Rudolph Favorite Animated Flick: He's the most famous reindeer of all, and this year, Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer takes top honors as Americans' favorite animated holiday movie with 30%. A Charlie Brown Christmas comes in second with 24%. 17% of U.S. residents enjoy How the Grinch Stole Christmas the most. Rounding out the top five are Frosty the Snowman with 10% and Santa Claus Is Comin' to Town with 3%.

• All is Bright for Silent Night: Its age may be nearly 200 hundred years, but for 19% of Americans, Silent Night never gets old. It takes the number-one spot as favorite holiday song this year. Irving Berlin's White Christmas comes in a close second, cited by 16% of U.S. residents as the holiday song they like to hear most. Jingle Bells keeps 11% of Americans "laughing all the way" while O Holy Night and Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer complete the list of top five holiday songs with 6% and 4%, respectively.

• The Ties That Bind...Playing Favorites: When it comes to holiday gatherings, most Americans admit there are certain family members with whom they *most* look forward to spending time. Close to one-third of U.S. residents -- 30% -- are eager to be with their children while 25% report they want to be in the company of their spouse or significant other. Parents come in third with 14%.

• Family Near and Dear...Except, Maybe the In-laws: A majority of Americans look forward to spending time with all of their family at holiday time. 57% report there isn't one relative they dread seeing. However, 12% of U.S. residents say in-laws are the family members with whom

they'd prefer to spend the least amount of time. 9% report they aren't looking forward to being with their parents.

Nature of the Sample: 1,003 Americans

This survey was conducted on December 9th and December 10th, 2008. 1,003 adults 18 years of age or older within the continental United States were interviewed by telephone. Telephone numbers were selected based upon a list of telephone exchanges from throughout the nation. The exchanges were selected to ensure that each region was represented in proportion to its population. The results of the entire survey are statistically significant at ±3%.
