How the Survey was Conducted

Nature of the Sample: McClatchy-Marist National Poll of 1,204 Adults

This survey of 1,204 adults was conducted July 15th through July 18th, 2013. Adults 18 years of age and older residing in the continental United States were interviewed by telephone. Telephone numbers were selected based upon a list of telephone exchanges from throughout the nation. The exchanges were selected to ensure that each region was represented in proportion to its population. To increase coverage, this landline sample was supplemented by respondents reached through random dialing of cell phone numbers. The two samples were then combined and balanced to reflect the 2010 Census results for age, gender, income, race, and region. Results are statistically significant within ±2.8 percentage points. There are 980 registered voters. The results for this subset are statistically significant within ±3.1 percentage points. There are 426 Democrats and Democratic leaning independents and 357 Republicans and Republican leaning independents. The error margin for Democrats and Democrat leaning independents is 4.7 percentage points, and the error margin for Republicans and Republican leaning independents is 5.2 percentage points. The error margin increases for cross-tabulations.
