

How the Survey was Conducted

Nature of the Sample: NBC 4 NY/Marist Poll of 861 New York 11th Congressional District Registered Voters

This survey of 861 registered voters in New York's 11th Congressional District was conducted October 19th through October 21st, 2020 by The Marist Poll sponsored in partnership with NBC 4 NY. Registered voters in the congressional district were contacted on landline or mobile numbers and interviewed by telephone using live interviewers. Survey questions were available in English or Spanish. Mobile and landline telephone numbers within the congressional district were randomly selected from a list of registered voters using the L2 voter file. The full sample is balanced to age, gender, race, education, party registration, and region based on the congressional district's voter registration list information and U.S. Census information. Assistance was provided by Luce Research for data collection. Results are statistically significant within ± 4.1 percentage points. There are 650 likely voters defined by a probability turnout model, which determines the likelihood respondents will participate in the November 2020 election based upon their chance of vote, interest in the election, and past election participation. The results for this subset are statistically significant within ± 4.7 percentage points. Tables include results for subgroups to only display crosstabs with an acceptable sampling error. It should be noted that although you may not see results listed for a certain group, it does not mean interviews were not completed with those individuals. It simply means the sample size is too small to report. The error margin was adjusted for sample weights and increases for cross-tabulations.
