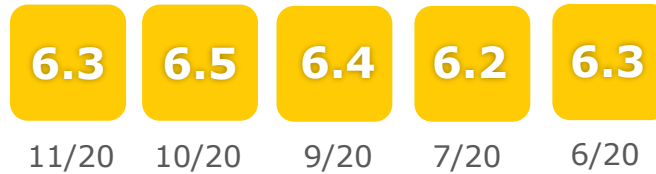
NATIONAL OUTLOOK INDEX

The Marist Poll's America Now: National Outlook Index provides insight into Americans' experiences and expectations for the future. Attitudes are measured along a scale of 0 to 10 with "0" indicating the lowest negative point of the scale and "10" noting the highest positive point.

The Marist Poll's America Now: National Outlook Index (NOI) stands at a 6.2 out of a maximum top score of 10. Attitudes about community life and personal health strengthen the overall index. Americans, though, express worry about the economy and the state of society and government. These indicators continue to weaken the index.



ECONOMIC



Americans remain cautious in their economic outlook. With the exception of Americans' perceptions of their future personal finances, there has been a dip in the NOI's economic indicators. Concern lingers about the jobs market and consumerism. In fact, the jobs market remains the lowest of all NOI items. Residents are tentative about their current and future finances.

HEALTH



Americans remain satisfied with their health and well-being. They see themselves as being in excellent health and are content with the life they are living. Though down slightly, Americans are also pleased with their access to health care. Attitudes about the risk to residents' current health is more positive than negative but is lower than the other health indicators.

COMMUNITY



The overall NOI continues to be strengthened by Americans' perceptions of life in their local communities. They feel safe in and satisfied with where they live. Though less so, they are also positive about their ability to make their community a better place and are satisfied with their community's beliefs and values. Attitudes about safety and overall satisfaction rank as the highest NOI items.

SOCIETY



Perceptions about society and government weaken the index. Though more positive than negative about their access to equal opportunity, they are tepid in their views that life for future generations will be better, and those in leadership positions are working to improve life for the average person. Americans are more pessimistic about living in a fair and just society.

HOW THE SURVEY WAS CONDUCTED

Nature of the Sample: Marist Poll of 1,313 National Adults

This survey of 1,313 adults was conducted January 24th through January 27th, 2021 by The Marist Poll. Adults 18 years of age and older residing in the contiguous United States were contacted on landline or mobile numbers and interviewed by telephone using live interviewers. Survey questions were available in English or Spanish. Mobile telephone numbers were randomly selected based upon a list of telephone exchanges from throughout the nation. The exchanges were selected to ensure that each region was represented in proportion to its population. Mobile phones are treated as individual devices. After validation of age, personal ownership, and non-business-use of the mobile phone, interviews are typically conducted with the person answering the phone. To increase coverage, this mobile sample was supplemented by respondents reached through random dialing of landline phone numbers. Within each landline household, a single respondent is selected through a random selection process to increase the representativeness of traditionally under-covered survey populations. The samples were then combined and balanced to reflect the 2017 American Community Survey 1-year estimates for age, gender, income, race, and region. Results are statistically significant within ± 3.3 percentage points. There are 1,153 registered voters. The results for this subset are statistically significant within ± 3.5 percentage points. It should be noted that although you may not see results listed for a certain group, it does not mean interviews were not completed with those individuals. It simply means the sample size is too small to report. The error margin was adjusted for sample weights and increases for cross-tabulations.

The Marist Poll America Now: National Outlook Index is reported on a 0 to 10 scale. A mean score for each sub-index statement was calculated. Overall economic, health, community, and society & government indices are derived by calculating an overall mean based on responses to the four sub-index questions in each category. The overall Marist Poll: America Now National Outlook Index is derived by calculating an overall mean based on responses to all sixteen sub-index questions.
